SPEAKERS

Charles Auld

Lead for the Faculty of Perioperative Care RCSEd. Consultant General Surgeon Dumfries and Galloway (retired). Previously served as member of Council, Chair of SSB General Surgery RCSEd and also served as a member of Council ASGBI and committee member of the SAC in General Surgery.



Graham Balmforth

Consultant Solicitor. Graduated in law from Oxford University and Leicester DeMontfort, he read for the Bar at Nottingham Law School and was called as a Barrister of Lincolns Inn in 1998. He worked as an advocate until 2012 when he qualified as a Solicitor. Since then, he has been principally occupied in complex clinical cases and those frequently involving the Court of Protection (he is a registered Higher Courts Advocate). He is a member of the Leeds and District Medico Legal Society and the London Medico-Legal Society as well as the Institute of Medical Ethics. He lectures on the law relating to Human Tissue.

Nicholas Fletcher

On graduating from University of Salford in 2001 as a Registered Nurse, Nicholas secured a position as a Scrub Practitioner at Salford Royal to then progress quickly to Charge Nurse and lead for Urology surgery in theatres. He is currently a Urology Surgical Care Practitioner. He is keen to promote the role of the SCP and has been active in trying to capture the role through audits of activities that the practitioners engage in. He has been developing and is the current chair of the Association of SCPs (AoSCP).

Council Member of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh since 2015, Anna is a Consultant General and Upper GI Surgeon at the Royal Infirmary Edinburgh and Honorary Senior Lecturer for the University of Edinburgh. She has had a long-standing involvement in Patient Safety, having been named the Doctor of the Year in the 2010 Scottish Health Awards for her role as Lead in NHS Lothian for implementing surgical standards of the Scottish Patient Safety Programme. She is current Chair of the RCSEd's Patient Safety Group.



Juliette Murray

Incoming FPC Lead Juliette Murray is Deputy Medical Director for Acute Services at NHS Forth Valley. She trained as a general surgeon with subspecialty interests in breast and paediatric surgery. She previously worked as a consultant in NHS Lanarkshire and was also Deputy Director of Medical Education there as one of her main interests is in teaching and training. Her interests in service redesign and role extension led to her taking up a post with the Scottish Government as clinical lead of the Access Collaborative in 2017.
